Invitation

The Pittsylvania County Purchasing Department, on behalf of the Pittsylvania County Board of Supervisors, hereby issues to qualified firms, licensed in the State of Virginia, a Request for Proposal (hereinafter referred to as "RFP"), for Financial Advisory Services.

Deadline

Four (4) copies of a sealed proposal and one (1) electronic version shall be submitted no later than 2:00 p.m. January 16, 2020 to the following:

All Proposals must be in a sealed envelope and clearly marked in the lower left corner: "Sealed Proposal - RFP #2019-12-18-, Financial Advisory Services" Proposals not so marked or sealed shall be returned to the offeror and will not be considered. Proposals shall clearly indicate the legal name, address and telephone number of the offeror (company, firm, partnership, individual). Proposals shall be signed above the typed or printed name and include the title of the individual signing on behalf of the offeror. All expenses for making Proposals to Pittsylvania County shall be borne by the offeror. All Proposals shall be received by 2:00 P.M., January 16, 2020. Any proposal received after this time and date will not be considered. The offeror has the sole responsibility to have the proposal received by the Pittsylvania County Purchasing Department at the above address and by the above stated time and date.

OUESTIONS:

- 1. All questions regarding this RFP must be made in writing. The written questions must be received by the County no later than 12:00 p.m., January 3, 2020. Questions may be emailed to: Connie.gibson@pittgov.org.
- 2. All responses to questions will be posted on Pittsylvania County website: www.pittsylvaniacountyva.gov by January 6, 2020, 4:00pm. The offeror has the sole responsibility to go to the website and receive the responses or by contacting Connie Gibson requesting them by emailed. The responses will be an addendum to the RFP. All such responses by the County shall become part of the RFP.
- 3. Oral instructions do not become part of the proposal documents.

This procurement shall be conducted in accordance with the competitive negotiation procedures of the Virginia Public Procurement Act – Section 2.2- 4302.2

Note: The County of Pittsylvania, Virginia does not discriminate against faith-based organizations in accordance with the *Code of Virginia*, §§ 2.2-4343.1, 1950 as amended or against a bidder or offeror because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by Federal, State, and County law relating to discrimination in employment or contracting.

The entire proposal, including Technical proposal, Proposal Cover Sheet, and any supplemental materials required to be provided by the offeror pursuant to the terms and conditions of the RFP, constitute the entire proposal.

The party hereby certifies that such is genuine and not collusive or sham; that said offeror has not colluded, conspired, connived or agreed, directly or indirectly, with any bidder or person, to put in a sham bid or to refrain from bidding, and has not in any manner, directly or indirectly, sought by agreement or collusion or communication or conference, with any person to fix the bid price or affiant or any bidder, or to fix any overhead, profit or cost element of said bid price, or of that of any other bidder, or to secure any advantage against Pittsylvania County or any person interested in the proposed contract.

I. BACKGROUND:

Pittsylvania County, VA ("County") is requesting proposals from experienced vendors for a Financial Advisor to perform general financial advising for the County's strategic use in decision making. Initial financial work may include examination of the County's long-term debt structure, existing opportunities for refinancing to minimize/reduce payment of interest, financial planning for outstanding debt not permanently financed, and/or other financial advising deemed necessary by the County.

II. SCOPE OF SEERVICE:

- 1. The Financial Advisor shall provide pertinent advice and counsel to the County concerning developments in the financial community in general and municipal finance in particular, to enable the County to remain in the best financial posture.
- 2. The Financial Advisor may assist in preparing information for presentation to the municipal bond rating services, in order to achieve and maintain the highest bond rating realistically achievable. The advisor shall support County officials in all presentations to the rating services.
- 3. The Financial Advisor shall assist the County in preparing information and fulfilling filing requirements as required by current and future bond convents on an as needed basis.
- 4. The Financial Advisor shall work with the County officials in developing options, plans, and strategies for financing planned capital improvements, taking into consideration costs and the effects that various alternatives have on the County financial standing.
- 5. The Financial Advisor shall develop necessary time schedules to assure that all work is initiated and completed in a timely manner, including all work associated with the issuance of bonds, notes, and other debt obligations.
- 6. The Financial Advisor shall advise the County officials, on bond sales climate and make recommendations with respect to whether sales of bonds should be competitive or negotiated. In the event the County decides to proceed with a bond refunding, the Financial Advisor shall:
 - Work with the County and Bond counsel in structuring the bond issue;
 - Review documents and other agreements affecting the financing;
 - Oversee the bond sale process, to ensure the County is securing the most favorable costs.
 - Assist in the preparation and development of all bond documents, the presentation to the rating agencies of the Authority's bonds and the preparation, review and printing of the Official Statement.
- 7. The Financial Advisor shall present a recommendation to the County, as to the magnitude of financial opportunities and how best to proceed.
- 8. The Financial Advisor, shall perform other duties as specifically requested or as necessary during the term of the contract.

III. PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS

The County of Pittsylvania, Virginia, requests written proposals for financial advisors to serve for the period of January 2020 through January, 2023. The initial contract for financial advisory services will be for a period of thirty-six (36) months with a renewal option at the discretion of the County for an additional three (3) years.

The continuation of the terms, conditions and provisions of this contract beyond the fiscal year is subject to approval and ratification by the Pittsylvania County Board of Supervisors and appropriation by them of the necessary money to be fund said contract for each succeeding year.

Proposal Submission

All proposals submitted shall be valid for a minimum of ninety (90) days following commencement of vendor questions. All proposals submitted shall become the property of the County.

Acceptance or Rejection of Proposal

The County reserves the right to reject any and all proposals received in this request. The County is not obligated to award a contract solely on the basis of this request and reserves the right to request clarification of information submitted and to request additional information of all offerors.

In accordance with specifications herein, the proposal shall provide a concise delineation of capabilities, experience and approach to the tasks as outlined in Scope of Services. Firms shall specifically address the following items:

- Provide record of expertise in financial management, particularly as related to the issuance of Municipal General Obligation Bonds for clients of similar complexity.
- A list of similar municipal financial advisory services clients with similar complexity, along with the amount and date of each of their issues sold since July 2014.
- Three (3) references in Virginia, from the above list since July, 2014, providing client name, location, summary of services, name, title and telephone number of primary point of contact.
- Brief narrative providing the reason(s) offeror is especially qualified to serve as the County's Financial Advisor.
- Provide an overview of the firm's municipal finance department.
- Provide qualifications and experience of primary personnel expected to be assigned to this project and their proposed responsibilities.
- Any other pertinent data relating to financial advisory services.

Evaluation and Selection

These criteria are to be utilized in the evaluation of qualifications for the development of a short list of those offerors to be considered for interviews and/or potential negotiations. Individual criteria may in all probability be assigned varying weights at the County's discretion, to reflect relative importance. Offerors are required to address each evaluation criteria in the order listed, and to be specific in presenting their qualifications.

- Firm's informational resources, knowledge and experience to support the proposed role of Financial Advisor. (30 points)
- Experience of financial advisors in municipal bond sales. (25 points)
- Experience and qualification of key personnel, who will be assigned as advisors. (25 points)
- Completeness and quality of proposal. (20 points)

The County may, if deemed necessary, ask for interviews with all or several of the firms submitting proposals

Selection Procedure

Selection shall be made of two or more Offerors deemed to be best qualified among those submitting proposals on the basis of the evaluation factors included in the Request for Proposal. Selected Offerors may be requested to present and explain their proposals to the Evaluation Committee and furnish any additional information that may be sought by the Committee. The Offerors will be ranked and negotiations will be conducted with the Offeror ranked first. If a contract, satisfactory to the County, can be negotiated, the Contract will be awarded to that Offeror. If not, negotiations will end with that Offeror and the County would begin negotiations with the Offeror ranked second.

Basis for Award

Information and/or factors gathered during interviews, negotiations and any reference checks, in addition to the evaluation criteria stated in the RFP, and other information or factors deemed relevant by the County, shall be utilized in the final award.

IV. SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

BID ACCEPTANCE PERIOD: Any bid in response to this solicitation shall be valid for (90) days. At the end of the days the bid may be withdrawn at the written request of the bidder. If the bid is not withdrawn at that time it remains in effect until an award is made or the solicitation is canceled.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF AWARD: Upon the award or the announcement of the decision to award a contract as a result of this solicitation, the purchasing agency will publicly post such notice on the County's website, www.pittsylvaniacountyva.gov and on the County Public Notice Bulletin Board located at 1 Center Street, Chatham, VA 24531.

CANCELLATION OF CONTRACT: The purchasing agency reserves the right to cancel and terminate any resulting contract, in part or in whole, without penalty, upon 60 days written notice to the contractor. In the event the initial contract period is for more than 12 months, the resulting contract may be terminated by either party, without penalty, after the initial 12 months of the contract period upon 60 days written notice to the other party. Any contract cancellation notice shall not relieve the contractor of the obligation to deliver and/or perform on all outstanding orders issued prior to the effective date of cancellation.

OWNERSHIP/FOIA: Ownership of all data, materials and documentation originated and prepared for the County pursuant to the RFP shall belong exclusively to the County and be subject to public inspection in accordance with the Virginia Freedom of Information Act. Trade secrets or proprietary information submitted by an Offeror shall not be subject to public disclosure under the Virginia Freedom of Information Act; however, the Offeror must invoke the protections of Section 2.2-4342D of the Code of Virginia, in writing, either before or at the time the data or other materials to be protected and state the reasons why protection is necessary. The proprietary or trade secret material submitted must be identified by some distinct method such as highlighting or underlining and must indicate only the specific words, figures, or paragraphs that constitute trade secret or proprietary information. The classification of an entire proposal document, line item prices and/or total proposal prices as proprietary or trade secrets is not acceptable and will result in rejection of the proposal.

STATE CORPORATION COMMISSION IDENTIFICATION NUMBER: Pursuant to Code of Virginia, §2.2-4311.2 subsection B, a bidder or offeror organized or authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth pursuant to B-30 Title 13.1 or Title 50 is required to include in its bid or proposal the identification number issued to it by the State Corporation Commission (SCC). Any bidder or offeror that is not required to be authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth as a foreign business entity under Title 13.1 or Title 50 or as otherwise required by law is required to include in its bid or proposal a statement describing why the bidder or offeror is not required to be so authorized. Indicate the above information on the SCC Form provided. Contractor agrees that the process by which compliance with Titles 13.1 and 50 is checked during the solicitation stage (including without limitation the SCC Form provided) is streamlined and not definitive, and the Commonwealth's use and acceptance of such form, or its acceptance of Contractor's statement describing why the bidder or offeror was not legally required to be authorized to transact business in the Commonwealth, shall not be conclusive of the issue and shall not be relied upon by the Contractor as demonstrating compliance.

COOPERATIVE PURCHASE: If authorized by the Offeror, the contract resulting from this Request for Proposals may be extended to other public bodies, public agencies or institutions within the State of Virginia to purchase at contract prices and terms. Any public entity that uses the contract shall place its own order(s) directly with the contractor(s). Pittsylvania County Board of Supervisors is not a party to such contracts and is not responsible for placement of orders, payment or discrepancies of the participating jurisdictions. It is the Offeror's responsibility to notify the jurisdictions of the availability of contract(s). Offerors who do not wish to extend the terms, conditions and prices to other public entities shall so indicate in the proposal.

RENEWAL OF CONTRACT: This contract may be renewed by the County for one (1) -three year renewal. Price increases may be negotiated only at the time of renewal. Written notice of the County's intention to renew shall be given approximately 30 days prior to the expiration date of each contract period.

PURCHASING DEPARTMENT

I. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Reservation of County Rights:

The County reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids, to waive any informality and to make an award to a party other than the low bidder, if deemed in the best interest of the County, subject to the provisions under the Virginia Public Procurement Act.

The County does not discriminate against faith-based organizations.

2. Laws of the Commonwealth:

Any purchase order/contract resulting from this bid process shall be governed; in all respects whether as to its validity, construction, capacity, performance or otherwise; by the laws of the Commonwealth. Successful bidders providing goods to the County herewith assure the County that they are conforming to the provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, as well as the Virginia Fair Employment Act of 1975, as amended, where applicable and Section 2.2-4311 of the Virginia Public Procurement Act which provides:

In every contract of over \$10,000 the provisions in 1 and 2 below apply:

- (1) During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:
 - A. Nondiscrimination Clause: The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, or other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment, except where there is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the contractor. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
 - B. Equal Opportunity Employer: The contractor, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, will state that such contractor is an equal opportunity employer.
 - C. Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule or regulation shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose of meeting the requirements of this section.
- (2) Subcontractors: The contractor will include the provisions of the foregoing paragraphs A, B, and C in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000 so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.
 - (3) Drug Free Workplace During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees to (i) provide a drugfree workplace for the contractor's employees; (ii) post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution,

possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the contractor's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition; (iii) state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor that the contractor maintains a drug-free workplace; and (iv) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that such provision will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

3. <u>Tax Exemption:</u>

The County is exempt from State sales, and use taxes and will issue a Certificate of Exemption upon request. Deliveries against any items of this bid procedure shall be free from any excise or transportation taxes. Excise exemption registration NO. 54-600-1508 may be used when required or necessary on behalf of the County.

4. Modifications, Additions, or Changes:

Modifications, additions, or changes to the terms and conditions of this invitation to bid may be cause for rejection of your bid. All bids shall be entered on the official bid forms, if provided. Bidders who attach or submit bids on their or any other forms may be considered unresponsive and may be rejected if an official bid form is provided.

5. <u>Delivery Point:</u>

Except when otherwise specified herein, all items shall be F.O.B. delivered to any point within the County as directed by the Central Purchasing Department.

6. Transportation and Packaging:

The authorized agent by signing this bid certifies and warrants that the bid price offered for F.O.B. destination, includes only the <u>actual</u> freight rate costs at the lowest and best rate and is based on the actual weight of the goods to be shipped. Except as otherwise specified herein, standard commercial packaging, packing and shipping containers shall be used. All shipping containers shall be properly and legibly marked or labeled on the outside with the commodity description and number, size and quantity.

7. Evaluation of Bid Documents:

If any prospective bidder is in doubt as to the true meaning of any part of the specifications or other bid documents, the prospective bidders shall submit a <u>written</u> request, within the time frame provided, after receipt of the invitation to bid to the Central Purchasing Department. The Central Purchasing Department will have final authority to review any discrepancies or deficiencies in the specifications and then make the necessary interpretations or revisions. Interpretations or revisions shall be made official by the issuance of any necessary addendum and distributed to all potential bidders. The Central Purchasing Department will not be responsible for explanations or interpretations of the bid documents, except as issued in writing by the Purchasing Manager and/or County Administrator.

8. Default:

In the case of default by the successful bidder or failure to deliver the goods or services ordered by the time specified, the Department of Central Purchasing, after due written notice may procure these goods or services from other sources and hold the defaulting vendor responsible for any excess cost occasioned thereby.

9. Anti-Collusion Certification:

The authorized agent by signing this bid certifies and warrants that this bid is made without prior understanding, agreement, or connection with any corporation, firm or person submitting a bid for

the same materials, supplies, equipment or services, and is in all respects fair and without collusion or fraud. The signing agent understands collusive bidding is a violation of the Virginia Governmental Frauds Act and Federal Law and can result in fines, prison sentences, and civil damage awards. The signing agent also agrees to abide by all conditions of this bid and certifies that he or she is duly authorized to sign this bid for the bidder represented herein.

10. Kickbacks:

The signing agent certifies and warrants that neither he/she nor the bidder from whom he/she is authorized to act has offered or received any kickback from any other bidder, suppliers, manufacturer, or subcontractor in connection with his/her bid on this solicitation. A kickback is defined as an inducement for the award of a contract, subcontracts or order, in the form of any payment, loan, subscription, advance, deposit of money, services or anything, present or promised, unless consideration of substantially equal or greater value is exchange. Further, no person shall demand or receive any payment, loan, subscription, advance, deposit of money, services or anything of value in return for an agreement not to compete on a public contract.

11. Gifts by Bidder, Offeror, Contractor, or Subcontractor:

No bidder, offeror, contractor, or subcontractor, shall confer on any public employee or official having formal responsibility for a procurement transaction, any payment, loan, subscription, advance, deposit of money, services or anything of more than nominal value, present or promised, unless consideration of substantially equal or greater value is exchanged.

12. <u>Termination/Cancellation of Contract:</u>

Subject to the provisions below, the contract may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days advance written notice to the other party; but if any work or service hereunder is in progress, but not completed as of the date of termination, then this contract may be extended upon written approval of the County until said work or services are completed and accepted.

A. Termination for Convenience

In the event that this contract is terminated or cancelled upon request and for the convenience of the County, without the required thirty (30) days advance written notice, then the County shall negotiate reasonable termination costs, if applicable.

B. Termination for Cause

Termination by the County for cause, default or negligence on the party of the appraiser or firm shall be excluded from the foregoing provision; termination costs, if any, shall not apply. The thirty (30) days advance notice requirement is waived in the event of Termination of Cause.

C. Non-Appropriation Clause/Termination due to Unavailability of Funds in Succeeding Fiscal Years

When funds are not appropriated or otherwise made available to support continuation of performance in a subsequent fiscal year, the contract shall be cancelled and the contractor shall be reimbursed for the reasonable value of any non-recurring costs incurred but not amortized in the price of the supplies or services delivered under the contract.

13. Quantities:

Quantities set forth in this invitation are estimates only, and the successful bidder shall supply at bid prices actual quantities as ordered regardless of whether such total quantities are more or less than those shown.

14. Ordering:

All orders from the County shall be issued by the Central Purchasing Department. A County purchase order number is required for the contract; yet partial order quantities and deliveries will be accepted upon request or as outlined in the Special Specifications, by the Central Purchasing Department. No other department or personnel other than those in the Central Purchasing Department of the County are qualified to issue purchase orders, make changes in orders, or accept delivery on orders under this contract without specific written authorization being received by the contractor from the Central Purchasing Department or as otherwise specified in the Special Specifications.

15. Invoices/Billing Process:

Invoices for items ordered, delivered, and accepted by the Central Purchasing Department or authorized departments shall be submitted by the contractor directly to the Accounting Department, at the address shown on the purchase order. The purchase order number must be referenced on all invoices regardless of quantities delivered, backordered, etc. Any outstanding quantities not included in the billing or invoice should be shown on a separate statement specifically marked, as not being an invoice for payment yet is an accountability of items and cost outstanding.

16. Discounts:

All bids will be evaluated and awarded on <u>net</u> prices. Cash discounts will not be considered in making awards. If cash discounts for prompt payment are offered, it must be clearly shown on the bid forms in the space provided. On monthly invoices any payment terms must be clearly marked. The County will attempt to take advantage of any such discounts provided our timetable allows us to do so.

17. Hold Harmless:

The successful contractor assumes and agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Pittsylvania County, Virginia, its officers, agents, and employees from any claims, damages and actions of any kind or nature, whether at law or in equity, arising from or caused by the use of any materials, labor, goods, or equipment of any kind or nature furnished by the contractor, provided that such liability is not attributable to the sole negligence on the part of the using agency or to the manner outlined by the contractor and description literature or specifications submitted with the contractor's bid.

18. Warranty:

The contractor shall provide warranty documents on any material, goods or equipment of any kind or nature provided by the contractor, his subcontractor or other agents. The warranty shall be in effect for the period of time specified.

19. Contractual Intent

Upon successful award of this bid by the County, it is the County's intent to have a written contract fully executed by all participating parties. This contract shall delineate the capacity, performances and considerations for all parties involved.

The contents of the bid submitted by the successful bidder and the bid specifications shall become a part of any contract awarded as a result of these specifications. The successful vendor will be expected to sign a "Standard Contract for Services" with the County.

Sample contracts may be submitted by either party at the time of the bid, however, the County reserves the right to use its uniform contract format over all samples submitted.

20. Insurance

By signing and submitting a bid/proposal under this solicitation, the Bidder/Offeror certifies that if awarded the contract, it will maintain all required Worker's Compensation, Employer's Liability, Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability insurance coverage during the entire term of the contract and that all insurance coverage will be provided by insurance companies authorized to sell insurance in Virginia by the Virginia State Corporation Commission. Copies of insurance certificates shall be submitted with all bids/proposals.

21. Use of Name Brands Within These Specifications:

The name of a certain brand, make, manufacturer, or definite specification is to denote the quality to the specific brand, make, manufacturer, or specification named; it is to set forth and convey to prospective bidders the general style, type, character and quality of article desired, and wherever in specifications or contract documents a particular brand, make of materials, device or equipment shall be regarded merely as a standard. Any other brand, make of material, device or equipment which is recognized the equal of that specified, considering quality, workmanship and economy of operation and is suitable for the purpose intended, shall be considered responsive to the specifications.

22. Access To Records:

The County Administrator or his duly authorized agent, shall, until the expiration of three (3) years following the final payment on this Agreement, have access to and the right to examine and copy any directly pertinent books, documents, papers, and records of Lessor and Assignee involving transactions related to this Agreement. Lessor and Assignee shall have the reciprocal right, until the expiration of three (3) years following final payment on this Agreement, to have access to and examine and copy any directly pertinent books, documents, papers and records of the County Administrator in the event of litigation or arbitration involving this Agreement, rights of access, examination and copying hereunder granted to Lessor, Assignee, and Lessee shall continue until such claims have been finally disposed of.
