The Board of Supervisors unanimously voted to initiate a national search process for the next Pittsylvania County Administrator. The motion, which was passed during the Board's May 17 Business Meeting, directs County staff to initiate a national search as soon as practical. County staff will follow all relevant procurement laws in hiring a national search firm.

The Board of Supervisors unanimously passed two resolutions in support of renaming bridges in Pittsylvania after fallen Virginia State Police Officers. The Board is recommending that the U.S. 29 North Bridge in Hurt be named the "Trooper Henry Murray Brooks, Jr. Memorial Bridge" and the Route 57 Bridge in the Banister District to be named the "Trooper Henry Noel Harmon Memorial Bridge."

\$205,000 Allocated for Repairs for Wayside Park Swinging Bridge

The Board of Supervisors unanimously voted to allocate \$205,303 from the Building and Ground Improvement Fund toward needed repairs and

improvements to the trademark swinging bridge at Wayside Park. Some of the needed improvements include new timber decking, rail, and floor beams, repointing masonry joints, suspension cable and floor beam hanger system, and dismantling and removal of portions of the existing structure.

Chief of Mt. Cross Volunteer Fire and Rescue




