


Volunteer Agencies Utilizing ARPA Funds




Volunteer fire and rescue departments across Pittsylvania County are utilizing the County's ARPA funds for things like equipment purchases, station upgrades, debt servicing, and revenue loss. In total so far, \$521,303 has been allocated to 15 different agencies. These funds are from a \$1 million contribution of County ARPA dollars from the Board of Supervisors.

Flagging Underway in Internet Expansion Project



In anticipation of the 2022 VATI Grant being fully approved by the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development, RiverStreet Networks has been allowed to proceed while contracts are being secured by all parties participating in the VATI grant application. To date, RiverStreet has completed flagging in the Renan Exchange (shown in red on the map) and have started flagging in the Sandy Level Exchange (blue), while continuing to finalize the overall project design and engineering.

\$25 Adult Pet Adoptions for Next Three Weeks




