New Historical Marker



Community leaders, representatives from Pittsylvania County, the Pittsylvania County Historical Society, and Circuit Court Presiding Judge Stacy Moreau unveil a new historical marker for the Pittsylvania Courthouse. The marker highlights the 1880 U.S. Supreme Court Case Ex Parte Virginia, a case that reinforced the 14th amendment and authorized Congress to require States to not exclude black people from juries. The case started when a Pittsylvania County judge refused to allow black men on juries, a direct violation of the federal Civil Rights Act of 1875.




