

Tasty Thursday at the September Chowdown













Many thanks to Sunset Slush Bus and Collins Roadside Produce for joining Pittsylvania County and the community during the monthly Downtown Chowdown!



Pittsylvania County's first responders were on duty over the week, serving the citizens of the County. EMS responders answered 198 primary calls for service between September 14-20. Of those, volunteers responded to 160 of those calls – or 81%. Pittsylvania County Public Safety were the primary responders on 38 of those calls and outside agencies took eight. The volunteer fire agencies also responded to 62 fire calls.

Pittsylvania County Social Service to offer SNAP E&T



What is SNAP Employment & Training (SNAP E&T)?

SNAP E&T is a voluntary employment and training assistance program that helps SNAP recipients gain the skills, training and work experience necessary to find work that leads to self-sufficiency.

SNAP E&T Services Include:

- » Job training
- » Job search help
- » Work experience
- » Educational assistance (to obtain a GED and/or certificates, learn computer skills, etc.)
- » Resume help and practice interviewing
- » Transportation, work uniforms and tools
- » Referrals to community partners
- » And more!

How do I get started?

No additional application is needed! If you are a SNAP recipient interested in employment and training services, just tell your SNAP caseworker that you want to enroll in SNAP E&T. From there, a dedicated SNAP E&T worker will contact you with next steps.
