# Property Rezoned for New Jail by Pittsylvania County Board of Supervisors



The Pittsylvania County Board of Supervisors approved the rezoning of 32.26 acres for a new jail at its November 28 business meeting. The property is located is located at 11965 U.S. Highway 29 North, south of the Town of Chatham. The Board closed on the property in August at a cost of \$500,000.

# **Grant for Body Worn Cameras Approved**



The Pittsylvania County Sheriff's Office was awarded a grant for new body worn cameras and the Board of Supervisors (Board) approved the funding at its November 28 business meeting. The \$148,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, requires a 50% match from the locality. For this grant, the Board approved a match of \$148,000 for a total of \$296,000.

# Covers GIS, Legal, Finances





Site selection, land acquisition and financing were the main topics covered during the third session of the Pittsylvania County Citizens Academy on Wednesday, December 6 at the Community Center. Participants heard from GIS Systems Analyst Barry Guidry, who walked them through the process of using GIS and its filters for site selection purposes. County Attorney Vaden Hunt explained how local government acquires property and the many facets of those transactions. Procurement Manager Connie Gibson returned from session two to talk about how the County would solicit bids to design and build the hypothetical recreation facility – the mock project being used to showcase how local government works.

Finally, Finance Director Kim Vanderhyde went over how large projects are funded in the County and the many ways to do it. The session concluded with an interactive exercise where participants were asked to rank five potential projects currently being discussed in Pittsylvania County. Participants took into consideration the need, the cost and how the projects could be phased in given the County's debt capacity.


