RiverStreet's Initial "Take Rate" for Fiber Internet Exceeds Industry Standard in Pittsylvania County



The number of Pittsylvania County customers experiencing the ease of highspeed fiber internet with RiverStreet Networks continues to climb, with 253 activated as of February 16. Another 378 orders are currently in the queue for service.

RiverStreet Networks provided an update to the Pittsylvania County Board of Supervisors during its February 20 work session, noting that there are now 2,765 locations where service is available.

The Pittsylvania County Board of Supervisors passed a resolution requesting that the Virginia Board of Local and Regional Jails (BLRJ) approve key documents needed to move the new jail project forward at its February 20 business meeting.

The Community Based Corrections Plan Needs Assessment and Planning Study (CBCP) was submitted on behalf of the County in December by Moseley Architects. The Board is also seeking reimbursement from the state for eligible design and construction expenses.








Pittsylvania County's first responders answered the call to service this week, saving the lives and property of the County's citizens. EMS responders answered 201 primary calls for service between February 22-28. Of those, volunteers responded to 161 of those calls – or 80%. Pittsylvania County Public Safety were the primary responders on 40 of those calls, or 20%, and outside agencies took five.

The County's fire departments responded to 73 fire calls during that same period.

Reminder

4 PM BURNING LAW IN EFFECT

FEBRUARY 15th - APRIL 30th

MAXIMUM FINE \$500.00 BURNING LAW IN BRIEF:

- 1. No burning until after 4:00 p.m. if the fire is within 300 feet of woodland, brushland, or field containing dry grass or other inflammable material.
- 2. Fire must be attended at all times if the fire is within 150 feet of woodland or other dry fuel leading to woodland.
- 3. No fuel may be added or fire started after midnight.
- 4. Law applies to campfires, warming fires, brush piles, household trash, stumps, fields of dry grass and brush, or anything capable of spreading fire.

RT. 41 – FRANKLIN TURNPIKE <u>VDOT TRAFFIC STUDY</u>



The public is invited to attend a community meeting to provide input and receive information from VDOT regarding the "Project Pipeline" study of **Rt. 41 Franklin Turnpike** that began in May 2023 and is due to be completed in July 2024.

The purpose of this "Project Pipeline" study is to identify potential solutions to safety issues on Franklin Turnpike. The suggested improvements generated by this study can be used to apply for funding through VDOT's "Smart Scale" program, which evaluates and prioritizes potential projects based on key factors like how they improve safety, reduce congestion, and contribute to economic development.

Supervisor Ken Bowman, Chatham-Blairs District will be on hand, along with other county supervisors and VDOT representatives, to listen to citizens and business owners of the Mt. Hermon commercial corridor.
