


Overdoses in Pittsylvania County

Pot-bellied Pigs Available for Adoption





If you're looking for a companion that squeals rather than barks, Pittsylvania County Animal Control has the pet for you.

The County has at least 30 pot-bellied pigs available for adoption. The pigs came from Hurt and Dry Fork.

The pigs are being housed at Animal Control's new livestock pen and barn at its headquarters on Rainbow Lane, as well as at Cherrystone Veterinary Hospital in Chatham. If not already, the pigs will be spayed and neutered.

Pot-bellied pigs originated in Vietnam and are now kept as pets in the United States. They live about 10-15 years and grow to about 70-150 pounds. County to request additional funding for Ringgold Rail Trail



With the arrival of spring, many residents and visitors may be wondering about the status of repairs to the pedestrian bridge along the Ringgold Rail Trail. Since the damage that occurred in 2018 from Tropical Storm Michael and the flooding of Sandy Creek, the cost to repair the bridge has increased substantially. Therefore, Pittsylvania County is requesting a budget amendment from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to increase the amount awarded to the County by more than \$2 million.

Board Partners with Sheriff for Certified Crime Prevention Community Designation



The Pittsylvania County Board of Supervisors (Board) is partnering with the Pittsylvania County Sheriff's Office to have the County designated as a Certified Crime Prevention Community through the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS).

During its March 19 business meeting, the Board voted to adopt the resolution and ratify the document at its April 16 meeting. The resolution will become part of the application submitted to the state for participation in the program.

Mt. Cross to Focus Solely on Fire Service, Relinquishes First Responder Role




The Mt. Cross Volunteer Fire and Rescue Board of Directors voted unanimously on March 25 to relinquish its role as a first responder in Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and focus solely on fire service.


This change will not affect the current level of service for those within the Mt. Cross service area as the following fire and rescue agencies currently provide Emergency Medical Service (EMS) response and transport: Tunstall, Bachelors Hall, Mt. Hermon and the Danville Life Saving Crew. Pittsylvania County Public Safety also provides EMS service to this area as well.



Pittsylvania County's first responders answered the call to service this week, saving the lives and property of the County's citizens. EMS responders answered 158 primary calls for service between March 21-27. Of those, volunteers responded to 133 of those calls – or 84%. Pittsylvania County Public Safety were the primary responders on 25 of those calls, or 16%, and outside agencies took three.

The County's fire departments responded to 53 fire calls during that same period.
