Board Approves 56-cent Real Estate Tax Rate, County, Schools Budgets



The Pittsylvania County Board of Supervisors approved a real estate tax rate of 56-cents per \$100 of assessed value, as well as the Fiscal 2025 School and County budgets at a called meeting April 4.

This is the first adjustment of the tax rate in six years, which currently stands at 62-cents. The Board was presented with a proposed tax rate of 59-cents in early

March but following a public hearing on March 28 and budget work session on April 2, decided to lower that rate to 56-cents in response to citizens' concerns.

Investigation by Pittsylvania County Public Safety Averts Possible Water Contamination





Potential contamination of two town water systems were averted by the observation of a reddish sheen on a pond and an ensuing investigation by Pittsylvania County Public Safety as to its source.

Hurt Mayor Gary Hodnett was notified about a visible sheen on the pond in the late afternoon of Tuesday, March 26. Fed by small creeks, the pond eventually drains into the Staunton River which contains the intake system that supplies water to the towns of Hurt and Altavista.










Pittsylvania County's first responders answered the call to service this week, saving the lives and property of the County's citizens. EMS responders answered 205 primary calls for service between March 28 – April 3. Of those, volunteers responded to 144 of those calls – or 70%. Pittsylvania County Public Safety were the primary responders on 61 of those calls, or 30%, and outside agencies took five.

The County's fire departments responded to 86 fire calls during that same period.
