Minimal Damage Reported From Tropical Storm Debby



The majority of Pittsylvania County residents likely felt relieved as the effects of Tropical Storm Debby were not as severe as initially anticipated. Local rainfall amounts on Thursday ranged from around two to more than six inches in the Danville area, according to the National Weather Service.

The Danville area's 6.22 inches of rain on August 8 is considered a record amount for that day, according to the National Weather Service.

Pittsylvania County Public Safety Director Chris Key reported that there were 27 calls for trees blocking a roadway and those were handled by either VDOT or the fire department. Another four calls were for trees blocking a roadway with electrical lines involved and those were handled by the fire department and the power provider. A tree fell on one house and there were electrical lines involved, but there were no injuries, and the house remains livable. A motor vehicle crash was caused by another fallen tree and there were five calls for downed power lines.

Key noted that there were no reports of flooding as of Friday morning, Aug. 9. The Virginia Department of Transportation had some concern Thursday about the bridge on Route 40 over the Pigg River, but the crest did not reach a point where the bridge needed to be closed.

By Friday morning, there were 45 reported power outages in the County and the storm, downgraded to a tropical depression, has since moved north.

Pittsylvania County school children got two more days of summer vacation as the storm postponed the start of the school year by two days, with classes schedule to begin Monday, August. 12.








Pittsylvania County's first responders answered the call to service this week, saving the lives and property of the County's citizens. EMS responders answered 209 primary calls for service between Aug. 1-7. Of those, volunteers responded to 173 of those calls – or 83%. Pittsylvania County Public Safety were the primary responders on 36 of those calls, or 17%, and outside agencies took five.

The County's fire departments responded to 81 fire calls during that same period.
